Flanges, stainless sheets/strips, aluminum extrusions, bearings, candles, solar cells, steel pipes, tires, wooden bedroom furniture, wood flooring—if you import any of these items, you're not going to want to miss this seminar. That's because all of these items are on an ever-growing list of goods that are subject to antidumping or countervailing duties (AD/CV). Unfortunately, most U.S. importers are completely unaware of the financial risk involved when purchasing such items overseas, and they fail to understand that additional duties may be due months to years after the goods have cleared. It's vital for importers to educate themselves to protect their bottom line and limit exposure to non-compliance.


